Transforming Lives...

David Livingstone, Christ's Ambassador to Africa

David Livingstone (b. 1813) was one of the great missionaries of the 19th Century. Born into a working class family, Livingstone went on to earn a medical degree and do scientific research and exploration in Africa as well as mission work. Livingstone's contributions include the first white exploration of large sections of Africa, the establishment of numerous mission schools, the establishment of relations with numerous tribal chiefs throughout Africa, and the preaching of the Gospel. Livingstone died in the interior of Africa, but his body was

transported over land, shipped to England, and buried in Westminster Abbey. It is said that his African friends discovered his body slumped over in prayer. Livingstone loved his home country of Scotland but he was first of all an ambassador of Jesus Christ. Here is how he described his own service to the Lord:

People talk of the sacrifice I have made in spending so much of my life in Africa. Can that be called a sacrifice which is simply paid back as a small part of a great debt owing to our God, which we can never repay? Is that a sacrifice which brings its own blest reward in healthful activity, the consciousness of doing good, peace of mind, and a bright hope of a glorious destiny hereafter? Away with the word in such a view and with such a thought! It is emphatically no sacrifice. Say rather it is a privilege. [Anxiety](#), sickness, suffering, or danger now and then with a foregoing of the common conveniences and charities of this life, may make us pause and cause the spirit to waver and the soul to sink; but let this only be for a moment. All these are nothing when compared with the glory which shall be revealed in and for us. I never made a sacrifice.
